Reports:

Trustee Burton

• There is a proposed or existing House Bill to allow the inspection of septic tanks. If the septic tank fails the test, the owner will be required to pay for a new septic tank installation. Trustee Burton is working with a group to oppose this legislation. There is also legislation to require communities to pay for recycling.

Treasurer Ryan

- Tax bills were sent to the printer and will go out on July 1
- The new Deputy Treasurer, Nina Costello, will start on Monday [July 10]
- Delinquent taxes improving communications with taxpayers to give them advance notice of delinquent taxes prior to the delinquent notices being mailed so that they have more warning.

Supervisor Kullis

- There is a House Bill (item #5 under New Business) that would take away local regulation of gravel pits and assign oversight to a state agency (likely EGLE). The Township currently has authority over the gravel pits within our district. The Township office will provide contact numbers, and Supervisor Kullis urged the public to contact their legislators and express their opposition.
- Contractors are preparing to remove the roof on the Ellis Barn.
- We attended the Ribbon Cutting for the kayak/canoe launch on Fish Lake Rd.
- Shiawassee River Gauge is on the agenda.

 - Motion by Ruth to approve the budget amendments, Proposed Resolution 2023-13. Supported by Ryan. A roll call vote was taken. All those present voted yes. The motion was carried 5/0.
- 8. Opposition to HB 4526, 27, 28. Proposed Resolution 2023-14.
 - This resolution strongly urges the State House of Representative to oppose HB 4526, 27, 28 regarding granting oversight for gravel mining to a state agency and thus silencing local voices. Holly Twp. joins with the Michigan Township Association, the Michigan Municipal League, and the Municipal Assoc. of Counties in opposition to HB 4526, 27, 28.
- 9. Motion by Kullis to adopt this resolution, Proposed Resolution 2023-14. Supported by Winchester. A roll call vote was taken. All those present voted yes. The motion was carried 5/0.

10. Township Flag.

The Township does not currently have a flag. Is there interest in designing a flag?

11. Shiawassee River Guage

Students at UM have designed a device that measures river levels and speed of the current flow. This device would be mounted on the west side of the bridge on Fish Lake Rd., and users could use an app to view the depth and speed of the river. The cost of the device is \$1500/annual. We have a grant to cover \$1000 of the cost and need an additional \$500 from the Township to fund the device.

➤ Motion by Trustee Burton to approve the expenditure of \$500 to fund the Shiawassee River Guage. Supported by Clerk Winchester. A voice vote was taken. All those present voted yes. The motion was carried 5/0.
